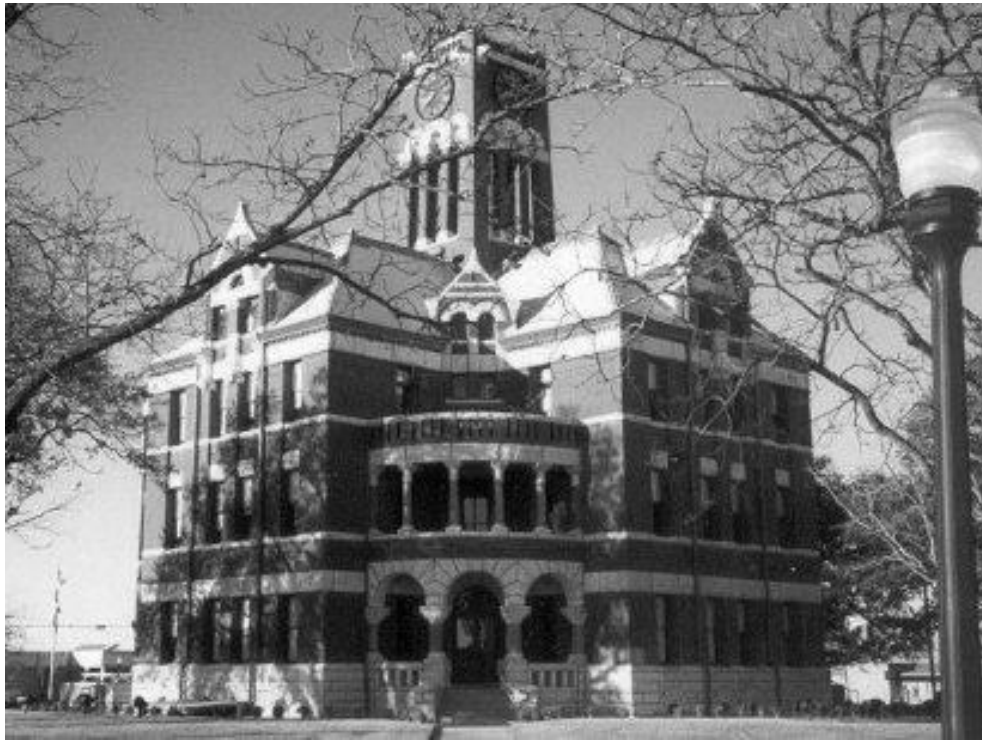

have not registered with 211 but it is a wealth of beginning information for you.

Tejas Medical Clinic

Medical, dental, behavioral, WIC (Women, Infants and Children program), community services, comprehensive health services, non-profit full service health center for the medically underserved population, 898 E. Richmond, but moving Oct. 1, 2017 to 185 Decker Lane (N on 141 across from the Assembly of God Church) Giddings, 844-892-2806, option 1.

Family Crisis Center- The base office is in Bastrop with a satellite office in Giddings. To access services, call Bastrop and they will make an appointment for you in Giddings, but there are no set days to walk in. They have a 24 hour Hotline, Crisis intervention, emergency shelter (domestic violence, sex and human trafficking for up to 30 day stay), supportive housing, counseling and support, and violence intervention. No appointment necessary for immediate crisis intervention. Hours- M-F 8-5 at Bastrop office-431 Old Austin Highway. The 24 hour hotline is 888-311-7755 or 512-303-7755 . Rejuvenation

For motel, gas, food, utilities, clothing or rent emergency assistance, it's a process. First, go to one of the churches in the ministerial alliance in Giddings who have vouchers. These are Immanuel Lutheran, Methodist, Martin Luther, 1st Assembly of God, Baptist, Concord, Catholic and Presbyterian churches. Then take that to the Police Station front desk who keeps a list of who has received help previously. If it is evening or weekends, then go straight to the Police Department where they may stamp it for approval. Then these businesses accept the voucher (which will later be sent to Rejuvenation for reimbursement)-food- B & W grocery, gasoline-Marion's by the Post Office, Apartment manager where they reside, Utilities-either the City of Giddings or Bluebonnet Electric or a One night stay at the Country Wide Inn motel or Knights Inn (290) , Clothing at Rejuvenation Thrift Store, 979-542-0134 on 77 across from First National Bank.

--**Meadows Ranch/Hope Rising Ministries** –Residential care. Recommendations through victims advocacy groups, state and federal law enforcement. Emergency placement for **children** that are not in a system, also. Works primarily with those that have experienced sexual trauma and/or exploitation with a specialty in working with those that are victims of **human sex trafficking**. Restoration includes assisting victims to heal and empower themselves, including art therapy, equine therapy and working within the community. Provides therapy for PTSD, depression, bipolar disorder, and grief. Duration of stay at shelter depends on the child’s situation. Ages range from 5-18. Male and Female. Licensed to be a child placement agency for foster care. Payment depends on insurance, but they can assist with sponsorships, if available.
